"Singin' in the Rain" is a song with lyrics by Arthur Freed and music by Nacio Herb Brown and it was written in 1929. Years later Arthur Freed conceived the idea of the film based on the back catalogs of songs written during the era by himself and Nacio Herb Brown. This resulted in a musical film of the same name (1952).
