





Oskar Kokoschka was an Austrian painter born on March 1, 1886, in Vienna. He is known for his powerful and emotional paintings that are part of the Expressionist movement. Expressionism focuses on showing strong feelings and inner experiences rather than realistic details.

Kokoschka's work is famous for its vivid colors and dramatic brushstrokes. He painted portraits, landscapes, and scenes of daily life, but he always aimed to show the emotions behind the subjects. One of his most well-known works is *The Tempest* (1914), which depicts a turbulent and emotional scene.

The first painting is called "The bride of the wind or The Tempest" (1914) and you can see it in the Kunstmuseum in Basel, Switzerland. This is considered Kokoschka's best known work, it is an allegorical picture featuring a self-portrait by the artist, lying alongside his lover Alma Mahler
