Renoir liked to paint scenes of people enjoying life, like in his famous work *Luncheon of the Boating Party* (1881). This painting shows a group of friends eating and relaxing by the water. Renoir's art is known for its bright colors, soft brushes, and happy themes.



He often painted outdoor scenes and used a lot of light and shadow to make his pictures look lively and warm. Renoir's style was very popular, and he is still a very popular artist today. He died on December 3, 1919, in Cagnes-sur-Mer, France.
