



The Origins and customs of Halloween Bl

Halloween is celebrated on October 31st every year. The tradition began over 2,000 years ago with the ancient Celtic festival called Samhain (pronounced "sow-in"). The Celts, who lived in Ireland, the UK, and northern France, believed that on this day, the line between the living and the dead became thin. They thought that spirits of dead relatives could come back to Earth and visit the living.



People lit large bonfires and wore costumes to scare away ghosts. They also made offerings of food to the spirits to keep them happy. In the 8th century, Pope Gregory III made November 1st a day to honor all saints, which became known as All Saints' Day. The night before was called "All Hallows' Eve," which later became Halloween.

When people from Europe moved to the United States, they brought their Halloween traditions with them. Over time, Halloween changed and became more about fun. It is a time when people enjoy dressing up in spooky costumes and

decorating their homes in creative ways. The most popular decoration is the jack-o'-lantern, a pumpkin carved with scary faces and lit with candles inside. Many homes also use fake cobwebs, skeletons, bats, and ghosts to create a spooky atmosphere. Some even put tombstones and skeletons in their yards to make it look like a haunted house.

Children love Halloween because they can dress up as their favorite characters, like witches, monsters, or superheroes. They go from house to house saying "trick or treat" and receiving candy from their neighbors. Another Halloween custom is throwing parties with games like bobbing for apples and costume contests. Some people also tell scary stories or visit haunted houses for a thrilling experience.

Halloween is a mix of ancient traditions and modern customs, making it a special and exciting holiday for many people around the world.
