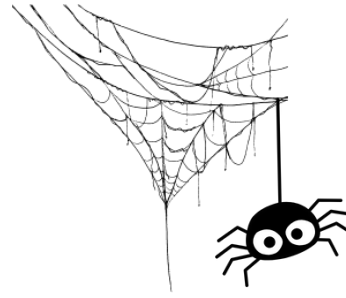
# Frankenstein Video Activity B1-B2

3 How does the scientist feel when he finds the correct combination?

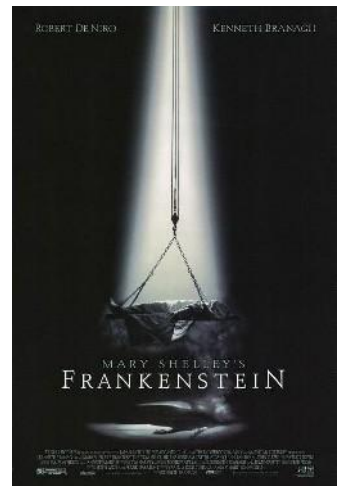
4 What element does the scientist use to bring the creature to life?

### The film

[Mary Shelley's Frankenstein](#) is a 1994 [science fiction horror film](#) directed by [Kenneth Branagh](#) who also stars as [Victor Frankenstein](#), with [Robert De Niro](#) portraying [Frankenstein's monster](#) (called The Creation in the film), and co-stars [Tom Hulce](#), [Helena Bonham Carter](#), [Ian Holm](#), [John Cleese](#), [Richard Briers](#) and [Aidan Quinn](#). Considered the most faithful [film adaptation](#) of [Mary Shelley's](#) 1818 novel, [Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus](#), despite several differences and additions in plot from the novel, the film follows a medical student named Victor Frankenstein who creates new life in the form of a monster composed of various corpses' body parts. **(information from Wikipedia)**

### The book

[Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus](#) is an 1818 novel written by English author [Mary Shelley](#). *Frankenstein* tells the story of [Victor Frankenstein](#), a young scientist who creates a [sapient creature](#) in an unorthodox scientific experiment. Shelley started writing the story when she was 18, and the first edition was published anonymously in London on 1 January 1818, when she was 20. Her name first appeared in the second edition, which was published in Paris in 1821. **(information from Wikipedia)**

### The author

[Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley](#) (1797 – 1851) was an English novelist who wrote the [Gothic novel](#) [Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus](#) (1818), which is considered an [early example of science fiction](#). She also edited and promoted the works of her husband, the [Romantic poet](#) and philosopher [Percy Bysshe Shelley](#). Her father was the [political philosopher](#) [William Godwin](#) and her mother was the philosopher and women's rights advocate [Mary Wollstonecraft](#). **(information from Wikipedia)**
