Second article, Questions

1 In the course of four centuries starting from the first colonisation attempt with Columbus in 1492 and until the end of the Indian wars at the end of the 19th century millions of Native Americans were killed. What were the reasons for this racial genocide as presented in the article?

The settlers were hungry for Indian land. Moreover, the Indians collusion with the British exacerbated American hostility towards them. The most important reason was that the Native populations were very different from the settlers not only in appearance but more importantly in beliefs and way of life.

2 What was the problem with President Jackson's "Indian removal bill" in 1830?

This was a policy that forced many Indian tribes to relocate. Many legislators tried in vain to stop this bill as immoral. The president's racial comments about the inferiority of the native populations compared to the settlers are testament to why the bill was passed. This resulted in a large number of populations being relocated forcefully in most cases. Thousands of lives were lost in an effort to diminish even more the Indian territory.
