Today, Thanksgiving is a national holiday and a time for family and friends to gather. Many people celebrate by preparing large meals that often include roast turkey, stuffing, cranberry sauce, and pumpkin pie. Before eating, it's common to



share what each person is thankful for. Thanksgiving is not only about food but also about gratitude and spending time with loved ones, remembering the help the Pilgrims received from the Native Americans.
